Part One: Birth and Family
1: When and where was your pensioner born?
<p>Frederick George Hancock was born in the third quarter of 1850 in Plymouth Devon (ref 1). In the 1851 Census a '0' year old Frederick G Hancock is recorded as living with his parents and siblings at 23 Higher Street, Charles the Martyr, Plymouth Devon (ref 2).</p>
2: Who were your pensioner's parents? Record any details you can find out about them here (e.g. occupation, religious affiliation, whether they could read or write)
<p>Frederick George's parents were Philip Hancock, who was recorded as being 49 years in the 1851 Census, a Hairdresser and his wife Mary Ann who was 48 years with no recorded occupation. Both had been born in Plymouth (ref 2).</p> <p>Philip and Mary Ann were married on 14th May 1824 and the marriage took place at St Andrew's Church in Plymouth. Mary's maiden name was 'White". The presiding curate was one Matthew Mundy and the witnesses William Hancock, Mary Hancock and James Boulter (ref 16).</p> <p>The Baptism of Philip Hancock was held on 8th March 1801 at an Anglican church in the parish of Charles the Martyr, Plymouth and his parents recorded as William and Grace (ref 11). No record has been found of Mary Ann's birth or baptism</p>

3: Did your pensioner have any siblings? What were their names, and how old were they in relation to your pensioner? Use this space to record anything else you have found out about them (e.g. occupation, later life)

Frederick George was the last of his parent's six children. They were all unmarried and living at home at the time of the 1851 Census at 23 Higher Street, Charles the Martyr, Plymouth (ref 2). The siblings were:

- Lydia, born in 1825, was 26 and a Dressmaker.
- Philip Henry, born in 1835 was 16, with no recorded occupation.
- William J born in 1838 was 13 and an Apprentice Printer.
- Charles S born in 1840 was 11 with no recorded occupation.
- Emily J born in 1846 was 5 and recorded as a scholar.
- Frederick G – our subject who was under a year old.

Records of Frederick's siblings baptisms have been found – Lydia 1825 (ref 29), Philip Henry 1835 (ref 19), William James 1837 (ref 20), and Charles Samuel Hancock 1839 (ref 21), but not for Emily who was born in 1846.

The family had also been recorded in the 1841 Census, prior to Frederick's birth with his older siblings recorded as Philip, William and Charles and living with parents Philip and Mary Ann (ref 9).

At the time of both the 1861 and 1871 Census' Frederick, was the only child still living with his parents. They had moved to 12 Buckwell Street, St Andrews, Plymouth (ref 3 & 4).

By 1881 Frederick and his father Philip who was widowed were living with Frederick's sister in law Charlotte Hancock at 15 Holborn Street Plymouth (ref 5). Frederick's mother Mary Ann had died in 1877 at the age of 75 (Ref 48) while Philip lived until 1890 and died at the age of 90 years (ref 12).

Frederick's Siblings:

Lydia Hancock's Baptism record is for 1825 (ref 29) and although she was on the 1851 Census for her family

(ref 2) there is also a possible burial record for her for that year. It states that Lydia Hancock aged 26 was buried on 13th April in the Parish of Charles the Martyr, Plymouth (ref 30).

There are no records for a **Philip Hancock** born in 1835 living in the Plymouth area after the 1851 Census. There was a Philip Hancock recorded on the 1881 Census in London. He was recorded as a Printer, born in Plymouth in 1835, and may be Frederick's brother. He was a widower and now living in Clapham, London with son Thomas H (1868) and two daughters Lydia M (1873) and Amy H (1876). The three children were listed as scholars. Living with them were a Thomas and Harriet Bibbing who were 61 and 62 years old and described as father and mother – probably Philip's dead wife's parents.

Thomas was a Bricklayer born in West Ham, Essex and his wife born in Whitchurch, Hampshire (ref 25).

By 1891 Philip, still a Printer and Stationer, was recorded as living in Battersea, London with wife Rachel E born in 1863 in Dover, Kent. The children living with them were Clara at 21 years who was not with the family in 1881 but also Lydia M and Amy H who were. Three younger children have also been born – Philip H aged 5, Mary Ann aged 4, and Charles T aged 3. A Mary A Richards aged 20 was described as a visitor (ref 26).

By 1901 the family had moved to Aycliffe House in Dover. Philip, now retired and Rachel were living with Clara, Philip, Mary and Charles, also a son Frederick born in 1892 and Lillian Shaw, a 16, year old servant. None of the family was recorded as working at this time (ref 27).

In the 1911 Census Philip and wife Rachel had moved to Clarence Lawn, Dover and had two children living with them Mary and Emily. Philip again was recorded as a Retired Printer and no one else had an occupation listed (ref 28).

There were several **William Hancock's** born around 1838 living in the Plymouth area. After 1851 it has not been possible to ascertain if one of them was Frederick's brother or not.

The next brother was **Charles S** born in 1840 and it is with his family that Frederick and his father, Philip lived after the death of Frederick's mother and prior to his marriage as recorded in the 1881 Census (ref 5). Charles Samuel married Charlotte, (formally Crocker) in Charles the Martyr, Plymouth on 22nd December 1861 (ref 22).

In 1871 Charlotte had been recorded as head of her family at the time of the Census as her husband was at sea as noted by the image of the Census record (ref 23). At this time Charlotte had four children Frederick C (1862), Lydia M (1865), Elizabeth A (1867) and Clara J (1869) (ref23). Again in the 1881 Census Charlotte is described, as head of the family, a Master Mariner's Wife, her husband was not recorded on the Census – presumably he was at sea. Two more daughters had been born, Rosaline B (1873) and Florence L (1878) (ref 5).

By 1891 Charlotte was a widow, 'Living on her own means' with Florence, who was now 13 years old. The other children were no longer at home, but there was also another Florence, surname Morga living with them and she was described as a grandchild, born in Devonport, Devon (ref 24).

No definite record has been found for **Emily Hancock**. An Emily Hancock did die in 1852 in Plymouth but it is not clear whether or not she was Frederick's sister (ref 10).

Part Two: Marriage and children/ boarders

1: Did your pensioner marry? What was their spouse's name, and when and where did they marry them? Frederick George Hancock married Sarah Nottle on 31st August 1885 at an Anglican church of Charles the Martyr, Plymouth. At the time of his marriage Frederick who was recorded as being a letter carrier was 34, and Sarah who had no recorded occupation was 21 years old. Philip, Frederick's father is recorded as being a Hairdresser and William Nottle, Sarah's father a Farmer (ref 13).

We know from the Census of 1891 that Sarah was born in North Hill, Cornwall (ref 6). Looking for 'Nottles' in the North Hill area of Cornwall (a hamlet set between Launceston and Liskeard) a Sarah Nottle was born in 1864 (ref 18), but there no details recorded of her living with parents in the area as a child.

In 1881 a Sarah Nottle aged 17, born in North Hill, Cornwall was working as a Housemaid with the Snell family at Welltown Farm House, Liskeard. This was about 8 miles south of North Hill and so could be the Sarah who later married Frederick (ref 17).

2: Did your pensioner have any children? What were their names, and when they were born? Use this space to record any extra details you can find out about them (e.g. occupation, where they lived later in life)

At the time of the 1891 Census, the first after their marriage Frederick George and Sarah were living in St Judes Terrace, Plymouth, and had had a daughter Lydia N in 1887. Frederick was recorded as being a Postman. Living with them was Mary A Goodwin, an aunt born in 1840 who was described as 'Living on her own means'. She had been born in Lezant, Cornwall and so may have been a relative of Sarah's, although no previous record of her was found. There was also a boarder John Beer who was a widower and Retired Gardener, having been born in 1803 (ref 6).

By 1901 Frederick and Sarah were living at 21 Tothill Road in Plymouth and had a seven year old son Philip W born in 1894 as well as daughter Lydia. Frederick's occupation was described as being 'Retired Civil Service (Post Office)'. Mary Goodwin and John Beer were no longer living with them, but William Nottle, Frederick's father in law – now widowed was (ref 7).

The image of the Baptism record for Philip William in 1894 includes a record for the baptism of his sister Lydia who had been born in 1886 – a discrepancy of a year with the 1891 Census cited above. Frederick George and Sarah were recorded as the parents of both Lydia and Philip William (ref 14).

Lydia's marriage to Richard Barrett Heathman a Clerk, was recorded as taking place at St Pancras church in Pennycross, Plymouth on 9th June 1906 (ref 35). No further records for Lydia have been found.

There is a school record for Philip Hancock dated 1st October 1906, naming his father Frederick as next of kin and giving his date of birth as 14th December 1893 – the family address was 5 Hazelwood Terrace. The school was Sutton High in Regent Street, Plymouth (ref 36).

Ten years later in 1911, only Philip William, a Chemist's Apprentice was living with his parents, now at 5 Hazelwood Terrace in Plymouth. Frederick now 59 was recorded as a 'Post Office Pensioner' (ref 8).

British Royal Air Force, Airmen's service records 1912-1939 show details of Philip Hancock's service during World War 1. He was a Wireless Operator in the Royal Flying Corps from 24th August 1916, and then joined the newly formed Royal Air Force on 1st April 1918. The person to be informed if he was a casualty was his father at 5 Hazelwood Terrace. Philip is described as being 5ft 9ins tall, with no distinguishing marks, wounds or scars. Philip then transferred to the RAF Reserves on 10th March 2019 (ref 37).

Philip married Doris Marion Hammett on 5th September 1921 in the parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, a suburb of Plymouth (ref 38). From the Electoral Register we know that Philip was living with his parents at the house in Hazelwood Terrace in 1927 (ref 39).

Doris Hammett was born in Devonport, Plymouth on 9th December 1897 and baptised on 20th January 1908 in St Simon's Church, Plymouth. Her father was named as Thomas Turner and her mother Fanny Louise (ref 40). The Hammett family were found living at 2 Valletort Place, Devonport in the 1901 Census. Thomas and Fanny had three daughters Gertrude who was 5, Doris, 3 and Kathleen 1 year old (ref 41). Thomas was described as a 'Warehouseman Clothing' and his wife had no recorded occupation.

By 1911 Doris now 13 and Kathleen 11 were living with their grandmother Sarah Hammett (69) a widow of private means. Also in the household were her daughters Lilian (43), Emily (31) and Marianne (29). All were single with Lilian described as a 'School Mistress' and Emily a 'School Teacher'; Marianne had no recorded occupation. Doris and Kathleen were at school and there is another younger granddaughter living with the family – possibly their sister, Marjorie (2). A Sarah and Gerard Lewis – daughter and son in law completed the family. There was also an 'Ethel Knight General Servant Domestic' living with them (ref c). It is not known what happened to Doris' parents or her older sister Gertrude (ref 42)

Part Three: Work

1: What occupation was your pensioner recorded as doing in census years? Please make sure to state clearly which year you are referring to

Frederick George Hancock was born in 1850 (ref 1). In 1851 he was under a year old and living with his five older siblings and parents at 23 Higher Street in Plymouth (ref 2).

At the time of the 1861 and 1871 Censuses Frederick was the only child still living with his parents and in both these years the family were living at 12 Buckwell Street, Plymouth. In 1861 Frederick was described as a scholar, but in 1871 he had no occupation recorded (refs 3 & 4).

By 1881 Frederick and his father, now widowed were living with older brother Charles' family, although Charles is at sea. Frederick was described as a Letter Carrier (CSM) (ref 5).

In 1891 Frederick aged 39 was still a Postman (ref 6), but ten years later he was retired and described as a 'Retired Civil Service (Post Office)' on the Census of 1901 (ref 7). In 1911 he was described as a 'Post Office Pensioner (ref 8).

We know from Post Office records that Frederick joined the Post Office in 1872. In these records he was described as a Postman - Acting as-Inspector of Telegraph Messengers, at the time of his retirement in

1901. He retired at the age of 51 years, but lived until December 1934 another 34 years. On his death certificate Frederick's profession is recorded as Inspector of Telegraph boys – G.P.O. He died of:

- 1a Cerebral Haemorrhage
- b Arteriole Sclerosis
- 2 Senility.

The informant of Frederick's death on his Death Certificate was his daughter in law - Doris Marion Hancock who had been present at his death (ref 31). His wife Sarah was named as a link person for Probate and she was left £1,712 8s 6d (ref 32). Sarah stayed on in the house at 5 Hazelwood Terrace and was living there alone at the time of the 1939 Census (ref 33). She died on 30th December 1942 and her link person was named as Doris Marion Pearce. Doris was now married to Alfred Downing Pearce and she was left £900 in 1942. (ref 34). It was likely that Philip W had died in 1931 (ref 45).

At the time of the 1939 Register Doris Pearce was living at 5 Tothill Avenue, Plymouth and although she was recorded as married her husband was not listed. Living with Doris was Gertrude, her sister - who was a Clerk in the Post Office and was single. Also a Joan Wilson (Hancock) aged 10 who was at school - (ref 46). Joan Hancock's birth in 1929 was recorded, citing her mother's maiden name Hammett – so it seems likely that Philip W had a daughter not long before he died – thus continuing the Hancock family to the next generation (ref 47).

2: What occupations were people living with your pensioner (e.g. spouse, children, boarders) doing in the census years? Please make sure to state clearly which year you are referring to

Frederick's wife had no recorded occupation on any of the Census returns.

Frederick's father – Philip was recorded as a Hairdresser in 1841, 1851, 1861 and 1871 (ref 9, 2, 3, 4). By 1881 he was retired and his death occurred in 1890 when he was 90 years old (ref 12).

Mary Ann, Frederick's mother was not recorded as having an occupation.

Of Frederick's siblings his older sister Lydia was recorded as a Dressmaker in 1825 (ref 2), Philip as a Mariner (refs 5, 23 photo image & 24), William James as a Printer (App) (ref 2) and Charles as Printer (25), Printer & Stationer (ref 26).

Sarah – Frederick's wife was not recorded as having an occupation.

There is no record of Lydia his daughter having an occupation, but her husband Richard Barrett Heathman (ref 35) was a Clerk.

Philip William, Frederick's son was recorded as a Chemist's Apprentice in 1911 and was in the Royal Flying Corps during WW1 (ref 37).

Part Four: Anything Else/Later Life

Devon, Land Tax And Valuation Records for Plymouth inform us that Frederick owned the house at 5 Hazelwood Terrace in 1910. He, wife Sarah and son Philip were living here at the time of the 1911 Census (ref 8). The image of this records states that the rateable value was £22 and the 'Original gross value ' of the house was £520 (ref 43).

In addition the 1910 Devon, Land Tax And Valuation Records also named Frederick as the owner of another house in the area at 7 & 9 Beaumont Road, in Plymouth East. The rateable value of No. 7 was £11 and for No. 9 it was £6. The 'Original gross value ' of No. 7 was £375, but that for No9 is not recorded (ref 44).

No further information has been found about the life of Frederick between his retirement in 1901 and death in 1934
