- 4) William Stacey born 1881. He married Rose 1902. He was a Draper. His wife worked in their business. In 1901 is listed as a Tailor in Duloe. They have a lodger Uncle Henry William Stacey who is a Mason.
- 5) John Francis Stacey born 1882. Married Mary Crapp (1882 ?) in 1904 and lived at Foxhole, St Austell. In 1914 signed up for the Army stating his occupation as Shoesmith/ Furrier
