WALTER CLUTTERBUCK AND HIS TRAVELS ON THE RAILWAY BY CHLOE BENNETT

Walter Clutterbuck died on the 15th June 1912 in the Retreat, Fairford, Gloucestershire. He had moved from his childhood home in Gloucester north to Sheffield and then further north to Edinburgh and had retired to Gloucester with his wife. His wife predeceased him in 1907.

The causes of death on his death dertificate were acute mania, valvular disease of the heart, and syncope (fainting). His occupation was recorded as Postal Superintendent, Wooton, Gloucestershire. The informant was Harold W. Scarvin of The Retreat, Fairford.

The Retreat was founded in 1822, as a private asylum built and run by an Alexander Iles.

Walter Clutterbuck was born in Gloucester in 1841, the son of an attorney at law, Walter Clutterbuck and wife Eliza. Heprobably had a prosperous background. He was baptised aged ten with his elder sister Julia, and younger sister Emily and brothers Charles and Daniel in July 1851 at the parish of St Mary le Crypt, Gloucester. This was not so unusual, as Maria (four) and Elizabeth Hodgeson, a baby were both baptised in Temple, Bristol in 1861. (see exemplar).

Walter lived with his parents and siblings in 1851 Longford St Mary, Gloucestershire, now near what is now the centre of Gloucester. According to his postal records he started work for the Post Office in 1859 aged about eighteen. Aged twenty, in 1861, he still lived with his parents and family who had moved to No1 Hannan Villa, Hamlet of Kingsholm Saint Catherine, Gloucestershire. Kingsholm is now on the edge of Gloucester. Walter was recorded on the 1861 census as a Clerk in the Telephone Comps.




Figure 1: Cheffin's Map of English and Scotch Railways, 1850. Source: Wikicommons (https://commons.wikimedia.org/wiki/File:Cheffins%27s_Map_of_English_%26_Scotch_Railways,_1850.jpg)

Sometime in the early 1860s Walter had moved 354 miles north to Sheffield, possibly travelling by train. The Post Office ran mobile sorting offices, known as Railway Sorting Offices and later as Travelling Post offices or TPOs. The railways had expanded all over Britain on what was called standard gauge rail. Thanks to George Bradshaw there were monthly railway timetables produced from 1842. The rail network was run by a series of different rail companies, and 'confusion reigned at Gloucester Station where the broad-gauge Great Western Railway met the rest'.¹

By this time Walter had been working for the Post Office for a few years and maybe he worked in a TPO on his way from Gloucester to Sheffield. It is likely that by the time Walter that he would have worked in the Post Office which was located on the corner of Market Place, Sheffield. He would probably have lived in lodgings near to his work. Unfortunately, I can't find any details of his work record at this time.

Aged twenty-three in August 1864, he married, Sarah Ann Darbyshire (twenty-four) from Salford, thirty-nine miles away. Walter Blackwell Clutterbuck is recorded as attending the wedding, probably Walter's father. Also recorded on the marriage record is Joseph Blackwell (possibly of London), Amelia Geary Hoyle of Ecclehall Bielow (now part of Sheffield) and Julia Wild, all presumably adult witnesses to the marriage.

Sarah Anne who had been living in Salford with her father, a locomotive driver and her mother. She and her mother are not recorded as having an occupation on the 1861 census

although both her younger brothers worked. Did she meet Walter through his connection to the railway on the TPO?

Walter and Sarah went on to have a large family, eight sons and three daughters born between 1865 and 1894. The two eldest sons, Walter Charles (b 1865) and John A (b 1866) were born in Sheffield. There appears to be no record in the UK Postal Appointments books for the 1860s showing details of his appointments in this time. It would be interesting to find out how post office workers found jobs in other parts of the country.

By 1868 they had moved 250 miles north to Leith, Scotland, probably travelling on the train with their two small children to Scotland. Sarah's father as a locomotive driver may have had access to cheaper discounted tickets. It was in 5 Cochrane Place, Leith where the next son, Malcolm Fitzroy (b 11th November 1868 at 5 am) and their eldest daughter Blanche Emily (b 1870) were born. The family are recorded on the 1871 census as living in 5 Cochrane Place, Leith, a Victorian two storey terrace near Leith Links. Walter is recorded on the census as telegraphist Post Office.

It is likely that Walter worked in 1869 at the GPO in Waterloo Place, Edinburgh. It was built 'in 1861–65 on the site of the Old Theatre Royal, between Waterloo Place and North Bridge, Edinburgh, to the design of architect and Clerk of Works for Scotland, Robert Matheson. In 1861, Albert, Prince Consort laid the foundation stone'. The GPO building was next to Waverley railway station and connected to the station by a series of passages.²

Walter's father Walter (d 1868) and his mother, Eliza (d 1871) both died in Gloucester. His eldest sister Julia was recorded on the 1871 census as a schoolmistress and head of household in South Hamlet, Gloucestershire. Living with her are her younger sister Emily, brother Daniel, their servant Ann Smith and two Australian lodgers, a mother and daughter.

On the 1875 Valuation roll Walter, recorded as a postal telegraph clerk, lived in 5 Livingston Place, Leith as a tenant paying £15.0.0 a year rent to John Seleraig, a bootmaker. This street is on the same page of the Valuation roll adjacent to Cochrane Place, Leith so likely to be the adjoining street. so he didn't move far and maybe for more space due to the birth of their sixth child.

But by the 1881 census Walter was listed as telegraph superintendent (CS). The UK, Postal Appointments Books shows a record in December 1882 of W.C. Clutterbuck listed under 'situation to which nominated' 'Skilled Telest' in Edinburgh. This may be his son Walter Charles who was sixteen by this time.

The 1881 census records Walter and his wife with nine children living in 158 Leith Walk, a three storey Victorian terrace now set back from the Road. By the time of the 1885 Valuation

roll was recorded the family lived at 4 Dalmeny Street, South Leith, a four-storey tenement block. Walter was recorded as a clerk and paying £15 per year rent.

By 1891 census Walter was recorded as a postal telegraph assistant superintended and living in 70 Elm Row which where he and his family lived for at least the next ten years. The 1895 valuation roll listed him as a proprietor occupier paying feu duty of £4 and ten shillings living in a house valued at £26.00.00. 70 Elm Row appears on Google maps as a three-storey terrace block, now above a shop. His last child, a son John Albert, was born in 1894. The family numbered eight sons and three daughters. When Walter retired in 1901 only his wife and the two daughters and two of the sons, Alfred (twenty four) and Claud (eighteen) still lived at home.

Walter and his wife moved to Gloucester sometime after the 1901 census. One of their younger sons Granville had joined the South Africa Force with the South Wales Borderers in the Boer War. He was reported as missing (deserted) on 9 May 1900. Two years later in 1902 he was recorded in the Gloucestershire county directory living in 5 Denmark Road, Gloucestershire. So maybe Walter and his wife moved to be near the prodigal younger son. Walter's wife Sarah Ann died in 1907 in Gloucester. On the census of 1911 Walter was recorded with a servant Julia Ann in Wotton St Mary, Gloucestershire.

Walter Clutterbuck had a busy life moving from one end of the country to the other and back again. He had a large family and was fortunate that he did not lose his wife in childbirth. Many women died of complications after childbirth. After his busy life in bustling Leith and Edinburgh he may have craved for the country life again and a reunion with his son, Granville and moved back south, thanks again to the railway.

Three of Walter's children worked in the Post Office as postal telegraphists: Walter Charles, Blanche Emily, and Malcolm Fitzroy.. His younger daughter Ellen Frances married and died in Edinburgh in 1961. His younger son Claud Horace Trevelyan, construction engineer, married Eleanor Jane in 1905 and had one son Claud White Logan and died in 1968 with estate worth £29068.
